



Dr. Henry Goldschmidt is a cultural anthropologist, community educator, interfaith bridge-builder, and scholar of religious diversity. He is currently the Director of Programs at the Interfaith Center of New York, where he develops interfaith dialogue, social action, and religious diversity education programs for a range of audiences, including religious and civic leaders, K-12 teachers and students, social workers, and others. Henry received his Ph.D. in anthropology from the University of California at Santa Cruz in 2000, and taught religious studies and anthropology at Wesleyan University and elsewhere before coming to the Interfaith Center in 2010. Among other publications, he is the author of *Race and Religion among the Chosen Peoples of Crown Heights* and the co-editor of *Race, Nation, and Religion in the Americas*. He is a life-long, fanatic New Yorker, and lives in Brooklyn with his wife and two children.
